

DINING ROOM DRESS



**Casual/Dressy
attire is always appropriate.**

"Certain dining venues have a specific dress code. Comfort and good sense are the major considerations. Appropriate dress for Sunday Brunch and evening meals (after 5pm) include slacks and shirts with sleeves or jackets for men, and slacks, skirts or dresses for women. Casual attire is appropriate for other meals. Shorts, crop tops or tee-shirts with off-color or inappropriate sayings or images are not in good taste. Please remove hats in dining venues (exception: residents' guests are requested to observe these same considerations)."

Note from Lori: A revision to the dress code was made last year as we want all to feel welcome in The Lakeview, without placing a lot of restrictions; please be respectful.
