DINING ROOM ADVISORY COUNCIL – MINUTES

Thursday June 8, 2023 13:30pm Roadrunner Room Representatives & Residents Invited – in Person meeting

1. Call to Order and Determine Quorum

The meeting was called to order at 13:30 and a quorum was met. Minutes of the May meeting were approved.

2. Announcements / Comments

- A. Leo Bell, Jr. Chair
 - Mr. Bell presented a challenge coin which reflects the Front of the House & on reverse side the Back of the House. Mr. Bell had a demo made and passed around the committee for review and approval. The objective is to present to the winners on a monthly basis starting with the July winners. Mr. Bell states he will absorb the cost and will accept donations.

The challenge coin was approved unanimously and enthusiastically.

3. Dining Services – Ex-Officio Member Reports

- A. Lori Dewitt Resident Services Director BSTW absent
- B. Guy Fanelli Director Dining Services
 - 1. Mr. Fanelli reported that the Freedom House menu is under review and revision and will be presented to the Family Council in the near future.
 - 2. Liberty House reported loss of staff and addition of new member.
- C. Jennifer DeJarlais, Chef
 - 1. We have a new grill and service line employee
 - 2. Evaluation of current dinner sides is underway to include different green vegetables and new starches.
 - 3. Several other seasoning issues are being addressed.
 - 4. More items will be added to the Sunday brunch menu effective July 2nd.
 - 5. Resident request to add wings as an appetizer
- D. Nikki Villa Dining Services Manager
 - 1. Announcement that parties of 5 or greater must all be present prior to being seated. This has been implemented due to the fact that the server has to take drink and/or meal orders several times as members of the party arrive.

4. Standing/Ad Hoc Committee Reports

A. Dining Room Committee – Chair Leo Bell, Jr. Reminder that the next kitchen tour is on June 26th. Mr. Bell reminded committee members to wear their DRAC representative name tags. Members who need a tag should inform Ms. Reeder who will relay to Teresa in Resident Services.

- B. Quality Control Committee Vice Chair Sandi Snyder See attachment #2 report. All names of staff nominated for awards will be documented in this report.
- C. Menu Committee Secretary Nancy Reeder Disposables cost calculations are not complete. They will be available at the August meeting.

Menu Committee – Debbie White, chair. Mrs. White discussed review and modifications of the side dishes on the dinner menu with Chef Jen as reported earlier. She also requested addition of cookies as a dessert choice at dinner.

- D. Webmaster Committee Webmaster Ron Miller; report given by Mr. Bell.
 - a. June report emailed to members
 - b. Rosters will be updated on TouchTown

5. DRAC Representatives Comments

- 1. Member questioned why minutes need to be emailed/sent to constituents as they are posted on TouchTown and posted in minutes binders in the Library and in CC3. Consensus is that we want to make minutes available in several different options.
- 2. From Liberty House representative: veggies are often not fully cooked, there are frequent substitutions for menu items, no onions with the liver entrée, a la carte does not change and few options for desserts.
- 3. Other comments: rice not fully cooked & lid on green reusable soup container is difficult to remove and has resulted in spilling the soup.
- 4. Use of paper/wax paper on trays used to serve baskets and ribs rips easily and becomes attached to the food. Chef Jen stated that because of the size of the items, it is difficult to arrange on a plate; however, if the resident wants the meal on a plate, it can be requested of the server at the time the order is placed.
- 5. Resident questioned meaning of the BYO meal on the brunch menu and it was explained.
- Discussed frequency of buffet for brunch it was reported by Chef Jen that she had administrative approval to do a buffet for Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Thanksgiving and Christmas. It was also noted that linen costs have skyrocketed from \$1500 to \$4000/month.

6. Old Business

a. One more Representative needed for 2500-2800, Tower 1 and Liberty House.

7. New Business

A. Motion for change in Bylaws regarding neighborhood representatives made by Ron Miller. Motion to accept bylaw changes approved unanimously.

MOTION by Ron Miller, DRAC Representative Tower, 3 submitted in writing (via email) to the DRAC Secretary IAW BY LAW Article 10: AMENDMENTS

A. Proposed amendments or revisions of the Bylaws or Operating Procedures must be submitted in writing to the DRAC Secretary who will present the proposal for discussion at the next DRAC meeting.

Motion: Amend the DRAC By Laws for allowing representation by residents not living in a residential area.

BACKGROUND:

Some residential areas do not have DRAC representation. Solicitation of DRAC representatives or replacements have been unsuccessful. This impacts residents who do not have a dedicated DRAC Representative, and also impacts meeting quorum requirements. Currently there are five (5) unfilled representatives: Tower 1 (2); Residential Area 2500 - 2800 (1); Liberty House (2). Therefore these By Law changes seek to provide for all residents to have DRAC representation, and to lessen the impact of vacancies on meeting quorum requirements that if not met may negatively impact the ability of DRAC to conduct business.

BY LAWS to be amended:

ARTICLE 2: ELECTION PROCEDURES

Current By Law:

- A. Nominations
- 4. Candidates must live in the area they wish to represent.

Proposed By Law:

A. Nominations

4. Candidates **should** live in the area they wish to represent. Candidates from any area may complete a "Notice of Intent to Stand for Election" if they want to make themselves available to fill vacant positions if appointed by the Chair.

Current By Law:

- B, The Elections Committee shall conduct the election as follows (See Appendix B.)
- 2. Prepare a slate of nominees for all areas.

Proposed By Law:

- B, The Elections Committee shall conduct the election as follows (See Appendix B.)
- 2. Prepare a slate of nominees for all areas. If there are vacant nominees for any area then residents from another residential area may be appointed by the Chair.

Current By Law:

ARTICLE 4: Members

D. Representatives **must** be residents of the area they represent.

Proposed change:

ARTICLE 4: Members

D. Representatives **should, if possible,** be residents of the area they represent.

Current By Law:

ARTICLE 5: TERM OF OFFICE

C. If a member is unable to fulfill the normal term of office, the Chair will solicit a replacement from the same residential area for the remainder of the year.

Proposed By Law: ARTICLE 5: TERM OF OFFICE

C. If a member is unable to fulfill the normal term of office, the Chair will solicit a replacement from the same residential area for the remainder of the year. If no resident is able to serve, a resident from another residential may be appointed by the Chair.

B. A vote for approval of the proposed changes will occur the next regularly scheduled meeting following the discussion.

1. The point of awarding and selecting a kitchen/back-of-the-house employee and a server of the month

should be to improve the quality of the work done in both areas and to reward excellence in both areas.

- 2. Guidelines for selecting the back-of-the-house employee of the month:
 - a. Guy, Brad, and Nikki should normally make this nomination
 - b. The employee's response to training received
 - c. Scholarship eligibility for a BSTW award
 - d. Shift performance
 - e. Unexcused absences
 - f. Positive comments from residents
 - g. Supervisor's assessment of work quality and attitude

3. Guidelines for selecting the server of the month:

- a. The DRAC members should normally make this nomination
- b. The server's courtesy toward BSTW residents
- c. Acknowledgement of residents as they enter or get seated
- d. Cheerful attitude and accommodation to resident dining requests
- e. Appearance including name tag displayed and dressing
- f. Observed actions beyond expectations

g. Any pertinent comments from the portal and comment cards h. Guy, Brad, and Nikki's comments

4. Other considerations:

- a. The DRAC secretary will keep a record of each awardee for the previous 6 months
- b. A photo of the awardee should be posted in the servery and printed in the Road Runner
