This human touch is essential in making sure recyclables are handled responsibly, keeping valuable materials out of landfills and giving them a second life.

#### **Revised Pet Policy Effective 1 December 2024**

We are excited to announce that the revised Pet Policy for Blue Skies of Texas will go into effect on 1 December 2024. This updated policy was developed with input from residents and staff to ensure it is fair, clear, and supportive of a harmonious community for all.

Here are the key updates:

- Definition of Pets: The policy applies specifically to dogs and cats. Other
- animals will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Leash and Supervision Requirements: Pets must always be leashed or securely enclosed when outside a resident's home. Cats not leash-trained must be transported in a secure carrier when entering or leaving buildings.
- Visitor Pet Rules: Pets belonging to visitors must follow the same rules as resident pets. Residents are responsible for ensuring their guests comply with the policy.
- Aggression Policy: Blue Skies has zero tolerance for aggressive behavior to ensure the safety of both residents and pets. Such cases will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.

For emotional support animals, proper documentation, including a doctor's note, is required to qualify under the Assistance Animal Policy. This ensures transparency and fairness across the board. We encourage all residents to review the full policy for detailed information. We will announce when it has been placed in the Policies & Procedures binder, located in the Library.

## BST Employee Gift Acceptance ~ Maureen Parrish

The BST Code of Conduct states employees will NOT solicit or accept personal gifts from residents, their families, or vendors. As much as we value our residents/families and vendors, we want to maintain a professional boundary that is healthy for all. The holidays is a good time to remind everyone that there are only two instances that are exceptions to the policy: 1. stylists working in our salons may accept tips, 2. when the item(s) offered are perishable and shareable within the department – i.e. food items.

Residents/Families wanting to give a special "thank you" to staff may donate to the Employee Appreciation Fund at any time during the year or should consider speaking or writing directly to the supervisor of the staff you want to praise.

#### Holiday Cyber Security ~ Maureen Parrish

Another holiday season is upon us and that means...online shopping, pop-up ads with tempting offers, and exploring new websites in your search for the perfect "something." Agencies like the FBI, U.S. Secret Service, and the DHS Cyber Crimes Center are promoting caution due to cybercriminals being more active during the holiday season, taking advantage of people's distractions. Here are some tips to help you stay safe online:

**Be wary of phishing** - Phishing emails are more common during the holidays, so be careful of emails from unknown senders or links in suspicious messages. Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. You might get an unexpected email or text message that looks like it's from a company you know or trust, like a bank or a credit card or utility company. Or maybe it's from an online payment website or app. Scammers often update their tactics to keep up with the latest news or trends, but here are some common tactics used in phishing emails or text messages:

- Stating they have noted some suspicious activity, too many log-in attempts, or claim there is a problem with your account or your payment information if it is a website you have recently been active on, contact them directly to verify by phone.
- Messages sent that include an invoice you don't recognize.
- Unsolicited offers that want you to click on a link to make a payment or ask you to click on a link to receive a "special offer" or individual coupon.

**Use strong passwords** - Use a complex password for each device and don't use the same password for multiple accounts. You can use a password manager to help.

**Keep software up to date** - Enable automatic software updates to ensure your devices have the latest patches for vulnerabilities.

**Shop securely** - Only shop from trusted retailers and avoid websites you've never heard of. Check that the site uses SSL protection by looking for https in the URL.

**Use a secure payment method** - Use a credit card, pre-paid debit card, or a reliable third-party payment service like Google Pay or Apple Pay.

**Monitor your accounts** - Check your online accounts regularly for suspicious spending. You can also use text and email alerting services offered by many banks and credit card companies.

**Disable Bluetooth, wireless, and NFC when not in use** - These features can increase the risk of your data being intercepted.

Online shopping can be an excellent resource but also has some very real risks. Enjoy the upcoming holidays and stay safe out there!
