It has been a long-standing tradition for Blue Skies residents to thank our hourly staff through the Employee Appreciation Fund. Your gifts qualify as donations to the Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation, and as such, will be included in your annual charitable contribution statement (to be sent next January).

You can make a gift by placing a check (please use a check instead of cash) into the slot marked "Employee Appreciation Fund" at the Front Desk. Checks should be made <u>payable to AFVCF</u> or Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation with "Employees' Appreciation Fund" on the comment line. You may also make arrangements with Finance for a specific amount to be added to your monthly service statement to benefit this fund.

These funds are distributed twice a year (midyear and near the end of the year) to all qualifying, hourly-paid employees, except for the Beauty Salon employees, i.e., the only employees allowed to receive tips. Your check must be received, or your monthly gift must be set up with Finance, by no later than Friday, May 16 by noon to be counted in the upcoming distribution. Otherwise, such gifts will be applied to the late 2025 distribution. Special Note: In addition to these individuals you see often, such as the wait staff, housekeepers and custodians, and Front Desk/Courtesy Officer and Maintenance teams, we've been asked: "Who are some of the behind-the-scenes employees who benefit from the Appreciation Fund?" These employees include utility workers in back-ofthe-house BST kitchens, cooks, Finance hourly staff, and those who are part of the overnight Front Desk and Courtesy Officer team and the overnight shift nursing and assisted living team. ### This Spring don't let Scammers Spring one on you... ~ Ashlie Maltos

A UPS scam is a phishing scheme in which scammers pose as UPS representatives in fake texts or emails. UPS scam messages may mention a "missed" delivery or unpaid shipping fees, and they often include a malicious link that leads to a fake UPS website or payment portal. When targeted by a UPS scam, fraudsters urge you to click a link to track, reschedule, or pay for a delivery. However, doing so could infect your device with malware, direct your payment to the scammer, or trick you into sharing sensitive personal information such as your UPS password, home address, or Social Security number. One of the most common UPS scams involves scammers sending a message from a fake UPS email address or phone number claiming you missed a delivery. They'll often prompt you to click a link to reschedule for another day or update your delivery address, counting on your curiosity to entice you, even if you weren't expecting a delivery.

If you fall for a UPS text or email scam, the scammer might be able to:

- Steal your personal information
- Gain control of your devices
- Direct payments to their own accounts
- Commit identity theft using your data
- Sell your information on the dark web

### **AFIO Chapter**

The May 5th program will start with Mariska Khalikov, a high school senior preparing a study of intelligence and will present a short briefing on North Korea. The second part of the program will be an AFIO NOW video, The Red Line. Joby Warrick researched and wrote the book about the race to destroy the most dangerous chemical arsenal in the world as Syria unraveled in civil war. Very dangerous people had an opportunity to seize huge stockpiles of sophisticated nerve agents and the research facilities to make even more sophisticated weapons. Mariska Khalikov, a high school senior preparing a study of intelligence will present a short briefing on North Korea.

The San Antonio Chapter of the Association of Former Intelligence Officers offers this program to inform the public of achievements of the intelligence services that were not publicly known at the time.. The AFIO programs are presented as a free public service. The national office of AFIO is a 501(c)3 non-profit, non-political, educational association for current and former intelligence professionals and supporters of the US intelligence community.

The presentation starts at noon in the Roadrunner Meeting Room. All residents and their guests are welcome to attend.

Meal allowance carryover policy will be discussed at the **May 8** DRAC meeting at 1pm in the Roadrunner. Due to scheduling conflicts with Management, the executive committee was unable to meet to discuss the issues prior to our May meeting. Therefore, please attend the meeting and let your voices be heard. The purpose of the recommended change to the meal allowance policy carryover is to allow the residents the freedom to spend their meal allowance to fit their needs throughout the year. Circumstances will arise that may or may not be under the residents' control, which require them to lose a portion of the meal allowance at the end of several months during the year. By changing to a once-a-year cumulative carryover, all residents should benefit and not adversely affect, at the margin, the meal allowance subsidy provided by Blue Skies. After all, the meal allowance can only be used for food, and any amount left over will be transferred at years end. Currently, a resident has a choice at the end of each month to lose any amount over \$50/\$100 carryover or spend that amount on wine or ice cream, which may not be the healthiest choice.

The Cliburn International Competition has long been a top competition and is named for the famous pianist – Van Cliburn – who won the first Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow at the height of the Cold War in 1958.

Linda and I have attended some of the Cliburn competitions in person over the years, and now we can see and listen to the performances live (or recorded) in the comfort of our own home! And you can do it, too!

The best Cliburn performance I ever heard was in 2022, when Yunchan Lim from South Korea became the youngest performer ever to win the prestigious grand prize, at age 18. His version of the Rachmaninov Piano Concerto No. 3 in D Minor, op. 30, is revered. It's also available online for your listening pleasure.
