## **Need a Ride? Here's How to Catch the Blue Skies Shuttle!**

To keep things running smoothly, here's what you need to know when scheduling transportation:

- Plan Ahead: All requests must be submitted by 12:00 PM (noon) the business day before your appointment.
- For Monday Appointments: Please get your request in by 12:00 PM the Friday before.
- Earlier is Better: Submitting early gives us plenty of time to schedule and makes everything easier for you!

### Important Notes

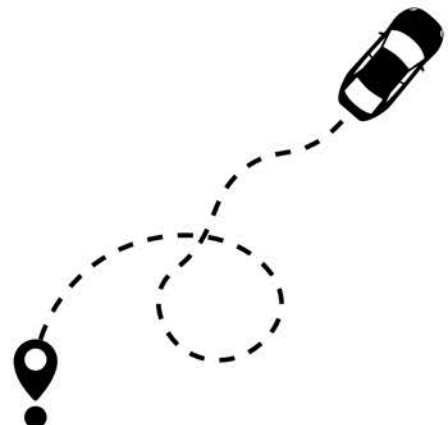
Volunteer drivers are available for medical appointments only.

### Beware of PHISHING Scams!

In today's digital world, scammers are becoming more creative—and more convincing—when trying to steal personal information. One of the most common tricks is called phishing. What is Phishing? Phishing is when a scammer pretends to be someone you trust to trick you into giving away protected and sensitive information through email, text message, or phone calls. Recently, our community members have received phishing emails from scammers pretending to be from USAA, Social Security Administration, and the IRS.

#### Red Flags you should watch for:

- Urgent or threatening language – Messages claiming “your account will be closed” or “you’ll lose benefits” unless you act immediately.
- Suspicious links – They may say “Click here to verify your information.” The link often takes you to a fake website.
- Requests for personal information – Legitimate companies will never ask you to confirm sensitive details through email or text.
- Strange email addresses – Even if the name looks familiar, the email address may be slightly different or misspelled.

#### Best ways to protect yourself:

1. Pause before you click and verify the source!
2. Do NOT share personal or financial details through an unverified email and never through text.
3. Use strong passwords.

If you think you've been targeted or received any suspicious communications, do not respond to the message. Reach out to the source through another method (i.e. calling your bank via a trusted phone number). Being cautious isn't being rude, it's being safe! Scammers count on people acting quickly without thinking. Take your time, double-check, and protect your information.

### Charitable Gift Annuities – Receiving Fixed Payments, Making A Future Gift

Establishing a charitable gift annuity (CGA) with the Air Force Villages Charitable Foundation may be an excellent option for you, for more than one reason!

A CGA with the Charitable Foundation is established with an amount of \$10,000 or more, as an irrevocable gift. Advantages for you as a gift annuitant include:

Quarterly payments based on a fixed rate of return (established by the American Council on Gift Annuities) which are partially tax-free through the annuitant's calculated life expectancy.

Table at right is for a single-life annuity.

A one-time charitable deduction, usually 40%-50% of the annuity amount.

The "charitable" aspect of a charitable gift annuity: any remainder from the CGA after you pass will benefit the AFVCF charitable fund of your choice.

In the case of a two-life CGA, while the two-life rate is lower than that of a single-life gift annuity, after one of the individuals passes, full payments continue to the second person through their lifetime.

In the case of a CGA funded with appreciated stock, capital gains tax is spread out over the duration of the CGA, rather than being incurred at once.

### Friday Night Lights Presents...

Be on the ball as leaves start to tumble and fall. Do you own a iPhone, iPad or any Apple device? If so, have you recently gotten an “Apple Security Alert” text? This text is alerting you that someone has allegedly made a large purchase after gaining access to the recipient’s Apple ID. These text messages will display different scenarios such as: “We have detected unusual activity on your Apple ID associated with a transaction at Apple Store-CA for \$\$\$, made via Apple told they must verify their identity by completing a security challenge and then changing their password.

How does this scam work? Well, the scammers are creating a sense of urgency that the user must quickly act without verifying the legitimacy of the message. When someone believes their money has been stolen and used for an unauthorized purchase, they’re more likely to follow the prompts and they end up falling for the scam.

Never follow the prompts that the text message gives you. When in doubt reach out to your bank institution to confirm whether or not the charges are real or call Apple directly.

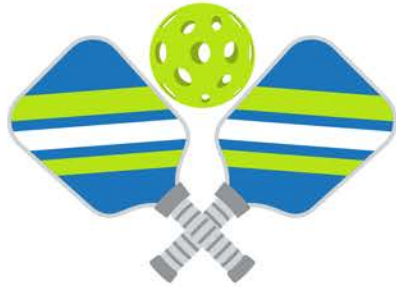

## RC Holding Elections for 2026 – Corlea Plowman

It's time to consider representing your neighbors on the Residents' Council. The Blue Skies Residents' Council serves as the Air Force Villages, Inc. (AFV) Board of Directors' officially sanctioned liaison between BSTW residents and the BSTW/AFV Management. The RC provides up-to-date information between Management and Residents and may also assist in problem resolution.

RC membership is comprised of two (2) Area Representatives from each geographic area of BSTW: Towers I, II, III, IV; Lakes 1200-1500; Lakes 1600-2000; Oaks 2100-2400, Oaks 2500-2800; and the Gardens.

Forms of Intent to Stand for Election to the RC are at the front desk, along with a box for deposit. Even if you are in the first or second year of your three-year term, you must complete a form of Intent to Stand for Election. Executive Committee forms are due by noon September 15 and Area Representative forms are due by 7pm, October 31. Installation is in December and those elected begin their duties in January 2026.

On Friday, July 11, 2025, a mother and her 9-year-old son were reported overdue for a day trip to Camp Wolfeboro, a popular scout camp in the Sierra Nevada Mountains located in California's Stanislaus National Forest. Fortunately, the next day the Calaveras County Volunteer Search and Rescue Team (SAR) was conducting its monthly training exercise received notification about the lost Mother and her son were missing since the previous day, and were not answering their cell phones. The SAR team contacted the SOS Command Post and received four wheel drive vehicles and air support. Shortly before 6pm, the lost mother and her son were found. The SAR team members were unable to communicate this message to their command post using conventional frequencies and cell phones from their deep woods location. So they used their amateur radio frequency to report this emergency. The call was immediately answered by a retired Amateur Radio Operator from his home, who immediately notified the local El Dorada 911 Center. Shortly thereafter, Mother and son were safely transported to waiting family members. To maintain communication skill and proficiency, the Blue Skies Amateur Radio Club Members have a weekly over the air "rag chew" session on their portable hand held radios to assure our safety during emergencies. 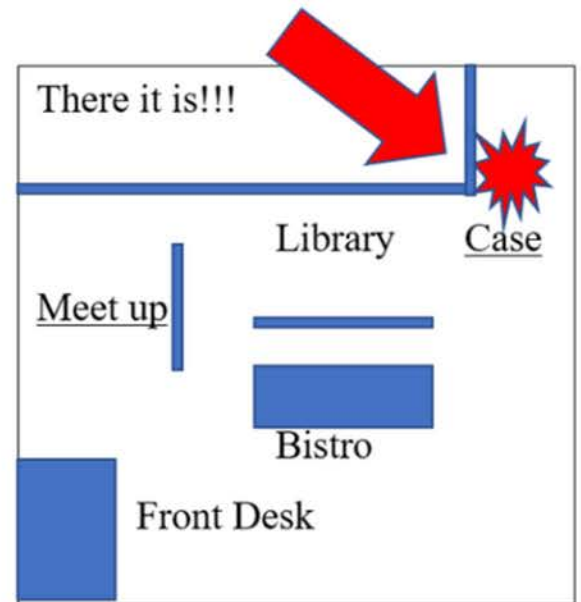

### Navy & Marine Corps 250th Birthday Celebration

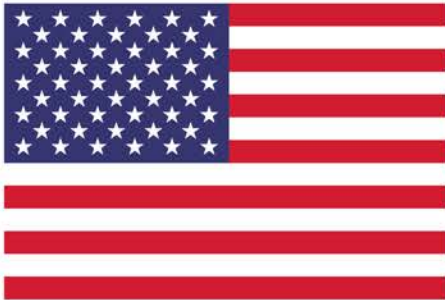
